

Request for equal facilitation and protection for online journalists

Dear Honorable Mr. Narendra Modi Ji, Prime Minister of Bharat,

Greetings from the Journalist and Media Association (JMA), a national body representing journalists working in various media platforms.

This would mark a significant step forward in safeguarding press freedom and addressing the discrimination faced by online journalists in India.
